Motion was made by Al Britt and seconded by Robert Stephens that the Coffee County Commission reappoint Mr. Lewis Skinner as District 4 representative for the CCPBA. All voted Aye.

Motion was made by Tom Grimsley and seconded by Bernest Brooks that the Coffee County Commission reappoint Mr. Billy Mixson as District 7 representative for the CCPBA. All voted Aye.

Sheriff Sutton informed the assembly of their contribution to be made to fellow deputy in Pike County whose daughter has been diagnosed with brain cancer. He encouraged all to participate in this worthy cause.

Commissioner Grimsley commented on the AL167 Project meeting held last week. He requested that Chairman Thompson and County Engineer Randy Tindell address a letter to our State and Federal officials requesting assistance with this project.

Commissioner Robert Stephens commented that he is receiving several dirt roads complaints and advised the public to please be patient. Due to the excessive rainfall and extreme cold temperatures, the repairs are limited.
