

June 28, 2010

On this the 28th day of June 2010 at 9:00 AM in the Office Complex, New Brockton, AL, the Coffee County Commission of Coffee County, AL met in a regular meeting. Those present at the said meeting were: Al Britt, Bernest Brooks, Kim Ellis, Tom Grimsley, Dean Smith and Robert Stephens. Jim Thompson, Commissioner and Chairman, was presiding with no absences.

The Chairman noted that a quorum was present and the meeting was called to order. The Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance were led by Commissioner Dean Smith.

Presentation was made by State Representative Terry Spicer of an appropriation in the amount of \$31,900.00. A portion of this money is for the renovation of the Farm Center but also various other programs within Coffee County will receive a portion these funds. Some of the programs include the senior centers, volunteer fire departments, Sheriff's volunteer posse and the Coffee County Arts Alliance. All Commissioners expressed their gratitude to Representative Spicer for all the support rendered to Coffee County and its citizens.

Commissioner Kim Ellis presented a proclamation to Big Jim Grimsley for using his resources to preserve an important portion of Coffee County's history by restoring the Prestwood Gristmill.

Motion was made by Tom Grimsley and seconded by Dean Smith that the Coffee County Commission adopt the Minutes of the June 14, 2010 meeting. All voted Aye.

Motion was made by Bernest Brooks and seconded by Kim Ellis that the Coffee County Commission approve the proposed plat for the re-subdivide of Lot #8 (approximately 1.9 acres) of Phase II Hunter Ridge Subdivision. All voted Aye.

Motion was made by Jim Thompson and seconded by Tom Grimsley that the Coffee County Commission reappoint Commissioners Al Britt and Dean Smith to the Wiregrass R C & D Council. Their term will become effective October 26, 2010. All voted Aye.

Motion was made by Dean Smith and seconded by Kim Ellis that the Coffee County Commission approve the credit application from Cross Construction Services for a line of credit not to exceed \$2500 at the Coffee County Landfill. All voted Aye.

Motion was made by Tom Grimsley and seconded by Robert Stephens that the Coffee County Commission authorize Chairman Thompson to sign the interlocal agreement with the City of Enterprise which allows the Sheriff Department to share in the 2010 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant. The County will receive \$4,586.80 of this grant and no matching county funds are required. All voted Aye.

Commissioner Al Britt stated that there were problems with destruction of property of dirt roads on CR618. Commissioner Dean Smith reiterated the problems with recreational vehicles destroying dirt roads and the actual destruction of county property on CR354 where barricades were burned. He asked the public to please report any vandalism to the County Sheriff's Department.

Also Commissioner Smith stated that the Coffee County Water Authority held a public hearing referencing the CDBG assistance. Motion was made by Dean Smith and seconded by Bernest Brooks that the Coffee County Commission send a letter to Rep. Spicer, Senator Holley and Congressman Bright to enlist their support of this ADECA funded project. All voted Aye.

Commissioners thanked the Grimsley Family for the contributions made to Coffee County. Also they wished everyone a safe July 4th Celebration.

With no further business, motion was made by Tom Grimsley and seconded by Dean Smith that the Coffee County Commission adjourn until the next meeting, July 12, 2010. All voted Aye.

After the meeting, several commissioners reviewed and approved invoices as follows: Accounts Payable Claims dated 06/15/2010 through 06/18/2010 in the amount of \$165,921.28 and Accounts Payable Claims dated 06/21/2010 through 06/28/2010 in the amount of \$140,489.16
