EMA Director John Tallas updated the Commission that Bama Jam Music Festival plans are progressing well and there are no problems that need to be addressed.

Sheriff Sutton updated the Commission on the Jail improvements and invited all to view the progress.

Motion was made by Robert Stephens and seconded by Bernest Brooks that the Coffee County Commission reappoint Mr. Ferrin Cox to the Coffee County Public Building Authority. All voted Aye.

Motion was made by Robert Stephens and seconded by Dean Smith that the Coffee County Commission declare an emergency situation and proceed in obtaining bids for a new roof for the Elba Courthouse. All voted Aye.
