On this the 26<sup>th</sup> day of February 2018, the Coffee County Commission met in a regular meeting in the Commission Chambers in New Brockton, AL at 9:00 AM. Those present at the said meeting were: Kim Ellis, Josh Carnley, Al Britt, Jim Thompson and Tom Grimsley. Jimmy Jones, Vice Chairman and Commissioner, was presiding with one absence, Dean Smith. John R. Morgan, Administrator/Attorney, was also in attendance.

The Vice Chairman noted that a quorum was present and the meeting was called to order. The invocation was given by Commissioner Grimsley, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Refuge Church came before the Commission requesting permission to use the Farm Center for their annual youth conference. Motion was made by Commissioner Carnley and seconded by Commissioner Thompson to grant request. All voted Aye.

Josh Elliot, Coffee County Soil and Water, presented the Annual Conservation Report to the Commissioners. Kenneth Sanders, District Chairman, thanked the Commission for its support.

Justin Jones, NBHS Head Football Coach, addressed the Commission to thank them for the use of the Farm Center for the Sports Banquet.

Motion was made by Commissioner Grimsley and seconded by Commissioner Ellis that the Coffee County Commission adopt the minutes of the February 12, 2018 meeting. All voted Aye.

Motion was made by Commissioner Carnley and seconded by Commissioner Britt that the Coffee County Commission sell five dump trucks and enter into a finance agreement with BancorpSouth to purchase six new dump trucks for \$853,710.00 with a five year term and the annual payment in arrears. All voted Aye.

EMA Director, James Brown updated the Commission on the third Civilian Response to Active Shooter Training that was held in Elba. Four more sessions will be held at ESCC on March 6<sup>th</sup>, March 30<sup>th</sup>, April 2<sup>nd</sup> and April 25<sup>th</sup>.

Sheriff Dave Sutton updated the Commission on the events that have taken place in Florida and assured everyone that Coffee County has some of the best trained deputies, police and resource officers around.

All Commissioners and Dean Blair thanked the Conservation Department, EMA and Sheriff's Office for the valuable services provided to Coffee County.

With no further business, motion was made by Commissioner Britt and seconded by Commissioner Grimsley that the Coffee County Commission adjourn until the next meeting on March 12, 2018. All voted Aye.
