

April 25, 2022

On this the 25th day of April 2022, the Coffee County Commission met in Commission Chambers in New Brockton, AL at 9:00 AM. Those present at the said meeting were: Kim Ellis, Josh Carnley, Al Britt, Jimmy Jones, Jim Thompson and Tom Grimsley. Dean Smith, Commissioner and Chairman, was presiding. John R. Morgan III, Administrator/Attorney, was also in attendance.

Chairman Smith noted that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order. Invocation was given by Commissioner Ellis followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

A proclamation was presented to Katy Lewis, Wiregrass Angel House, designating April 24-30, 2022 as "Crime Victims' Rights Week in Coffee County".

Motion was made by Commissioner Grimsley and seconded by Commissioner Britt that the Coffee County Commission adopt the minutes from the April 11, 2022 meeting. All voted Aye.

Motion was made by Commissioner Carnley and seconded by Commissioner Ellis that the Coffee County Commission authorize and execute an updated proposal from BancorpSouth financing five new dump trucks for \$769,460 with an annual rate of 2.410%. All voted Aye.

County Engineer Marty Lentz requested permission to send out new bids for hauling aggregates from Calera and Brierfield including a fuel index due to the rising cost of diesel fuel. Motion was made by Commissioner Britt and seconded by Commissioner Ellis that the Coffee County Commission honor the request. All voted Aye.

County Road 147 will be closed Tuesday and Wednesday to replace two cross drain pipes.

EMA Director James Brown stated a business disaster planning class with the Enterprise Chamber of Commerce will be held this Thursday.

Registrar Denine Richie thanked County Engineer Marty Lentz for the new maps and stated that letters were being sent out to notify voters of polling place changes.

County Agent Gavin Mauldin updated the Commission on upcoming events. Your money/your life class will be held at Zion Chapel this Thursday. A raised bed workshop will be at the Methodist Church in Elba on Friday. The 4-H Livestock team will be competing in Auburn on Saturday and the 4-H Shotgun team will also be competing this weekend.

With no further business, motion was made by Commissioner Grimsley and seconded by Commissioner Thompson that the Coffee County Commission adjourn until the next meeting on May 9, 2022. All voted Aye.
