

May 9, 2022

On this the 9<sup>th</sup> day of May 2022, the Coffee County Commission met in Commission Chambers in New Brockton, AL at 9:00 AM. Those present at the said meeting were: Kim Ellis, Josh Carnley, Al Britt, Jimmy Jones, Jim Thompson and Tom Grimsley. Dean Smith, Commissioner and Chairman, was presiding with none absent. John R. Morgan III, Administrator/Attorney, was also in attendance.

Chairman Smith noted that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order. Invocation was given by Commissioner Carnley followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

A proclamation was presented designating May 15-21, 2022 as "Emergency Medical Services Week" and May 18, 2022 as "Emergency Medical Services for Children Day" in Coffee County.

Motion was made by Commissioner Grimsley and seconded by Commissioner Jones that the Coffee County Commission adopt the minutes from the April 25, 2022 meeting. All voted Aye.

County Administrator John R. Morgan III stated that LSC Environmental was the only respondent to Bid#2022-19-Alternative Daily Cover Mulch. Their bid was \$22.25 per bag for 880 bags. Motion was made by Commissioner Ellis and seconded by Commissioner Britt that the Coffee County Commission award Bid#2022-19 to LSC Environmental. All voted Aye.

County Engineer Marty Lentz read the results of bid openings held on May 5, 2022 at 10:00 AM:

Motion was made by Commissioner Carnley and seconded by Commissioner Thompson that the Coffee County Commission award both bids to Johnston Trucking. All voted Aye.

The highway department will begin resurfacing County Road 147 next week.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thompson and seconded by Commissioner Carnley that the Coffee County Commission approve an agreement with Enterprise State Community College allowing the County Highway Department to remove and dispose of trees, concrete slabs, concrete block walls and poles located at the college baseball and softball fields. All voted Aye.

Grant Lyons, EMA, encouraged all citizens to sign up for the free weather warnings through the mass notification system. Hurricane season will start June 1<sup>st</sup>.

Dean Blair, E911, thanked Enterprise Rescue for the services they provide for the county.
